McQueen (15)

Dir. Ian Bonhôte, Peter Ettedgui. UK, 2018. 1h 51m. Starring Alexander McQueen, John McKitterick, Joyce McQueen, John Hitchcock, Danny Hall. An intimate look at the life of fashion designer Alexander McQueen, who rose from working class roots in south London to become a global superstar of haute couture. Innovative composer Michael Nyman, a personal favourite of McQueen's, wrote the soundtrack for this moving documentary.



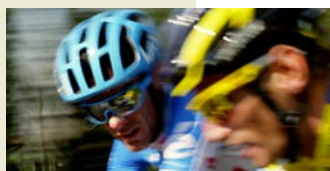
Zama (15)

Dir. Lucrecia Martel. Argentina, 2017. 1h 55m. Spanish/subs. Starring Daniel Giménez Cacho, Lola Dueñas, Matheus Nachtergaele, Juan Minujín, Nahuel Cano. Stuck on a remote South American outpost of the Empire, an 18th-century Spanish ambassador battles existential languor while awaiting instructions from government officials. This mysterious and dreamlike period piece is a scathing satire on colonial arrogance.



My Friend Dahmer (15)

Dir. Marc Meyers. USA, 2017. 1h 47m. Starring Ross Lynch, Anne Heche, Dallas Roberts, Alex Wolff, Vincent Kartheiser. A group of teens take the young Jeffrey Dahmer under their wing and make him a mascot for their gang of outsiders. This subversive serial killer drama is based on an autobiographical graphic novel by cartoonist John "Derf" Backderf, who was a classmate of Dahmer's at high school.



Time Trial (18)

Dir. Finlay Pretsell. UK, 2017. 1h 21m. Starring David Millar, Thomas Dekker. An exhilarating insight into the world of professional cycling through the eyes of David Millar, the only British rider to have won all of the Tour de France jerseys. Millar narrates this documentary about his final season in the saddle, discussing the intricate relationships of cyclists, crew, fans, and the media circus surrounding his final appearance at the Tour de France.

The Happy Prince (15)

Dir. Rupert Everett. UK, 2018. 1h 45m. Starring Rupert Everett, Colin Firth, Emily Watson, Colin Morgan, Edwin Thomas, Tom Wilkinson, Anna Chancellor. A poignant look at the life of Irish playwright Oscar Wilde who, exiled from Britain and living in Parisian squalor, revisits moments from his past on his deathbed. Rupert Everett writes, directs, and stars in the role that he was born to play.



In the Fade (18)

Dir. Fatih Akin. Germany/France, 2017. 1h 46m. German/subs. Starring Diane Kruger, Denis Moschitto, Numan Acar, Samia Muriel Chancrin, Johannes Krisch, Ulrich Tukur. Diane Kruger won Best Actress at Cannes 2017 for her formidable performance as a woman seeking revenge for the murder of her husband and young son in a terrorist attack. An edge-of-your-seat thriller that won the Best Foreign Language Film award at the Golden Globes.



That Summer (PG)

Dir. Göran Hugo Olsson. USA, 2017. 1h 20m. Starring Peter Beard, Lee Radziwill, Edith Bouvier Beale, Andy Warhol, William Vanden Heuvel. Three years before landmark documentary *Grey Gardens*, photographer Peter Beard chronicled life at their crumbling estate in The Hamptons during the summer of 1972. Lost for decades, his extraordinary footage re-emerges in this remarkable documentary about a community of influential artists.

Hereditary (15)

Dir. Ari Aster. USA, 2018. 2h 7m. Starring Toni Collette, Gabriel Byrne, Alex Wolff, Milly Shapiro, Ann Dowd, Mallory Bechtel, Zachary Arthur. After their reclusive grandmother passes away, a family tries to escape from the dark fate they've inherited. Ari Aster's directorial debut unleashes a nightmarish vision of deep psychological terror and has been dubbed the most frightening film in years by critics.



The Ciambra (15)

Dir. Jonas Carpignano. Italy, 2017. 1h 58m. Italian/subs. Starring Pio Amato, Koudous Seihon, Damiano Amato, Francesco Pio Amato, Iolanda Amato, Patrizia Amato. In a small Romani community on the outskirts of a coastal town in southern Italy, a 14-year-old boy embarks on a life of crime to support his family following their father's arrest. An impressive amateur cast gives this gritty crime drama a deep sense of realism.

Leave No Trace (PG)

Dir. Debra Granik. USA, 2018. 1h 49m. Starring Ben Foster, Thomasin McKenzie, Jeff Kober, Dale Dickey, Isaiah Stone, Dana Millican. Authorities force a father and his teenage daughter to rejoin society after they have spent years living off-the-grid in a nature reserve near Portland. A subtle and profoundly empathetic drama about a family's struggle to adjust to 'normal life' by the director of *Winter's Bone*.



Ocean's 8 (12A)

Dir. Gary Ross. USA, 2018. 1h 50m. Starring Sandra Bullock, Cate Blanchett, Anne Hathaway, Rihanna, Helena Bonham Carter, Mindy Kaling, Sarah Paulson, Awkwafina. Criminal mastermind Debbie Ocean puts together the perfect crew to pull off the heist of the century at New York's annual Met Gala. It's a fun-filled heist caper with an all-star cast of fierce female characters.



Arcadia (12A)

Dir. Paul Wright. UK, 2017. 1h 19m. An exhilarating study of Britain's shifting – and contradictory – relationship with the land compiled from 100 years of archive footage. Set to an expressive score by Adrian Utley (Portishead) and Will Gregory (Goldfrapp) alongside folk music from the likes of Anne Briggs, this captivating film captures the beauty, magic and sheer madness of rural Britain.



Freak Show (12A)

Dir. Trudie Styler. USA, 2017. 1h 31m. Starring Alex Lawther, Abigail Breslin, AnnaSophia Robb, Bette Midler, Ian Nelson, Celia Weston, Willa Fitzgerald, Laverne Cox, Larry Pine, John McEnroe. The story of a teenager who, despite attending an ultra conservative high school, makes the decision to run for homecoming queen. Trudie Styler's directorial debut, starring young British actor Alex Lawther, tackles bullying and prejudice in flamboyant style.

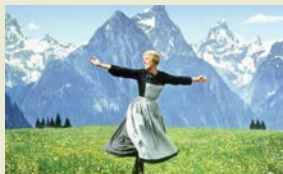
