Dir. Mike Leigh. UK, 2018. 2h 34m. Starring Rory Kinnear, Maxine Peake, Neil Bell, Pearce Quigley, David Moorst, Rachel Finnegan, Tom Meredith. 1819, Manchester: armed government militias attack workers at a peaceful prodemocracy rally in what became one of the most shameful episodes in British history. A politically charged historical epic by the Oscar-nominated British director Mike Leigh (Secrets & Lies, Vera Drake).

Dir. Panos Cosmatos. USA, 2018. 2h 1m. Starring Nicolas Cage, Andrea Riseborough, Linus Roache, Bill Duke, Richard Brake, Clément Baronnet. Surrealist revenge flick starring a typically unhinged Nicolas Cage as a lumberjack hunting down a sadistic biker gang at the gates of hell. An uncompromising fantasy thriller intensified by nightmarish visuals and a foreboding score by the late Jóhann Jóhannsson.



Fahrenheit 11/9 (15)

Dir. Michael Moore. USA, 2018. 2h 8m. Starring Donald Trump, Hilary Clinton, Vladimir Putin, Barack Obama, George W. Bush, Kim Jong-un. Filmmaker and activist Michael Moore explores the two most important questions of the Trump Era: how did we get here, and how do we get out? Moore combines his effective blend of humour, news footage, and interviews to reveal how fragile American democracy currently is.

Widows (15)

Dir. Steve McQueen. UK/USA. 2018. 2h 10m. Starring Viola Davis, Michelle Rodriguez, Cynthia Erivo, Elizabeth Debicki, Daniel Kaluuya. Four women pick up where their husbands failed after an attempted robbery goes spectacularly wrong. Oscar-winning director Steve McQueen and bestselling writer Gillian Flynn (*Gone Girl*) collaborate on this charismatic heist-thriller combining tense action with striking feminist commentary.



Don't Worry. He Won't Get Far on Foot (15)

Dir. Gus Van Sant. USA, 2018. 1h 54m. Starring Joaquin Phoenix, Jonah Hill, Rooney Mara, Jack Black, Tony Greenhand, Beth Ditto. The true story of John Callahan who forges a new career as a controversial cartoonist after a drunken car crash leaves him partially paralysed. An unflinching biopic that forgoes inspirational clichés with a powerhouse performance by Joaquin Phoenix.



Tehran Taboo (15)

Dir. Ali Soozandeh. Austria/Germany, 2017. 1h 36m. Persian/subs. Starring Farhad Abadinejad, Jasmina Ali, Rozita Assadollahy, Alireza Bayram. A subversive depiction of life in Iran told through beautifully accomplished rotoscope animation. Ali Soozandeh's debut exposes the double standards rife in modern-day Tehran via a transgressive slice-of-life tale featuring prostitutes, drug addicts, musicians, and mullahs.

Dir. Luca Guadagnino. Italy/USA, 2018. 2h 33m. Starring Dakota Johnson, Tilda Swinton, Mia Goth, Chloë Grace Moretz, Lutz Ebersdorf, Angela Winkler, Ingrid Caven. Evil envelops a renowned dance company and threatens to engulf the soul of a young, ambitious dancer. A daringly confrontational remake of Dario Argento's 1977 horror freak-out with a suitably melancholic score by Thom Yorke.

The Guilty (15)

Dir. Gustav Möller. Denmark, 2018. 1h 25m. Danish/subs. Starring Jakob Cedergren, Jessica Dinnage, Omar Shargawi. A high-concept, low-budget thriller about an emergency dispatcher frantically dealing with a phone call from a kidnapped woman. Gustav Möller's mercilessly gripping debut, claustrophobically confined to a single location, unfolds in real time. Winner of the World Cinema Audience Award at this year's Sundance Film Festival.

Columbus (12A)

Dir. Kogonada. USA, 2017. 1h 44m. Starring John Cho, Haley Lu Richardson, Parker Posey, Michelle Forbes, Rory Culkin. The son of a renowned architecture scholar finds himself stranded in Columbus, Indiana, after flying from Korea to care for his ill father. Kogonada's critically acclaimed debut is an exquisitely shot arthouse gem about family responsibility as well as a love letter to the city's striking urban landscape.

The Philadelphia Story + The Rebukes (U)

Dir. George Cukor. USA, 1940. 1h 50m. Starring Cary Grant, Katharine Hepburn, James Stewart. A charity screening in memory of The Ultimate Picture Palace's owner Becky Hallsmith, who died this year. Fantastic Beasts: The Crimes of Grindelwald (12A)

Starring Eddie Redmayne, Katherine Waterston, Dan Fogler, Alison Sudol, Ezra Miller, Jude Law, Johnny Depp. The young Albus Dumbledore asks former student Newt Scamander to help thwart the plans of powerful dark wizard Grindelwald, who is determined is raise pure-blood wizards to rule over all Muggles. This vibrantly drawn sequel is an entertaining return to JK Rowling's magical world of wizardry.

Wildlife (12A)

Dir. Paul Dano. USA, 2018. 1h 45m. Starring Jake Gyllenhaal, Carey Mulligan, Ed Oxenbould, Bill Camp, Zoe Margaret Colletti, Cate Jones. In 1960s Montana, a wife and her young son are left to fend for themselves after jobless and and directionless husband Jerry leaves to fight a forest fire on the Canadian border. Paul Dano's directorial debut is a slow-burning coming-ofage drama which sumptuously evokes small-town woes.

The Wild Pear Tree (15)

Dir. Nuri Bilge Ceylan. Turkey, 2018. 3h 8m. Turkish/subs. Starring Aydın Doğu Demirkol, Murat Cemcir, Bennu Yıldırımlar. Ambitious student Sinan returns to his rural village home with no job and a life-changing decision to make. Follow his dreams as an author? Or support his family and become a teacher? Nuri Bilge Ceylan's follow-up to his Palme d'Or-winning *Winter Sleep* is a sensual and lyrical portrait of a young man at odds with his hometown.
