### Lady Bird (15)

Dir. Greta Gerwig. USA, 2017. 1h 34m. Starring Saoirse Ronan, Laurie Metcalf, Tracy Letts, Timothée Chalamet, Lucas Hedges. A smart coming-of-age comedy about a loving but turbulent relationship between a teenager and her strong-willed mother. Greta Gerwig's semi-autobiographical directorial debut is an affecting portrait of adolescence and mother-daughter relationships.



### The Mercy (12A)

Dir. James Marsh. UK, 2017. 1h 42m. Starring Colin Firth, Rachel Weisz, David Thewlis, Genevieve Gaunt, Jonathan Bailey, Andrew Buchan, Ken Stott. The true story of amateur sailor Donald Crowhurst's disastrous attempt to complete the 1968 Golden Globe Race and his subsequent attempts to cover up his failure.



### Three Billboards Outside Ebbing, Missouri (15)

Dir. Martin McDonagh. USA, 2017. 1h 55m. Starring Frances McDormand, Woody Harrelson, Sam Rockwell. Pitch black comedy that won five BAFTAs (including Best Picture) as well as Oscars for Lead Actress and Supporting Actor. Frustrated by the failed investigation into her daughters' death, a tenacious woman takes on the town's police department in a PR war.



### Phantom Thread (15)

Dir. Paul Thomas Anderson. USA, 2017. 2h 10m. Starring Daniel Day-Lewis, Vicky Krieps, Lesley Manville, Camilla Rutherford, Jane Perry, Ingrid Sophie Schram. A beautifully acted and lusciously shot drama set in London's couture world of the 1950s. Jonny Greenwood provides the soundtrack for Daniel Day-Lewis's final on-screen role.

### I, Tonya (15)

Dir. Craig Gillespie. USA, 2017. 1h 59m. Starring Margot Robbie, Allison Janney, Bobby Cannavale. Based on unbelievable but true events, this is the story of one of the most sensational scandals in sports history. A darkly comic biopic that revolves around the fractious relationship between figure skater Tonya Harding and her abusive mother (Oscar-winner Allison Janney).



### Finding Your Feet (12A)

Dir. Richard Loncraine. UK, 2017. 1h 51m. Starring Imelda Staunton, Celia Imrie, Timothy Spall, Joanna Lumley, David Hayman, Indra Ové, John Sessions. When 'Lady' Sandra Abbott discovers that her husband of forty years is having an affair with her best friend, she leaves to live with her estranged bohemian sister in a heart-warming British comedy.



### The Shape of Water (15)

Dir. Guillermo del Toro. USA, 2017. 2h 3m. Starring Sally Hawkins, Michael Shannon, Octavia Spencer, Richard Jenkins, Doug Jones. Part fairy tale romance/part monster B-movie about a mute cleaner who falls in love with a mysterious creature who is held captive at a top-secret government laboratory. Winner of four Oscars, including Best Picture and Best Director.

## A Fantastic Woman (15)

Dir. Sebastián Lelio. Chile, 2017. 1h 44m. Spanish/subs. Starring Daniela Vega, Francisco Reyes, Luis Gnecco. After her lover suddenly dies, a transgender woman confronts suspicion from the police and contempt from his grieving relatives in an emotionally gripping drama featuring beautiful visuals and stylish flights of surrealism. Winner of the Best Foreign Language Film Oscar.



## Black Panther (12A)

Dir. Ryan Coogler. USA, 2018. 2h 14m. Starring Chadwick Boseman, Michael B. Jordan, Lupita Nyong'o, Danai Gurira, Daniel Kaluuya. Marvel Studio's latest comic book adaptation is a bold step forward for black superheroes — and superhero films in general. T'Challa returns home to the secret African nation of Wakanda, but a hostile outsider challenges his claim as king.



## Dark River (15)

Dir. Clio Barnard. UK, 2017. 1h 30m. Starring Ruth Wilson, Mark Stanley, Sean Bean, Esme Creed-Miles. A young woman returns to rural Yorkshire after her father dies and clashes with her estranged, older brother for control of the family farm. A brooding British drama from the director of *The Selfish Giant*, that features heartfelt performances by Ruth Wilson and Mark Stanley.



## Makala (U)

Dir. Emmanuel Gras. France, 2017. 1h 37m. Swahili/French/subs. Starring Kabwita Kasongo, Lydie Kasongo. A young Congolese villager hopes to offer his family a better future using the only resources he has: his two hands, the surrounding bush, and an iron will. This slow-burning and beautifully shot documentary won the Critics' Week Grand Prize at Cannes.

## You Were Never Really Here (15)

Dir. Lynne Ramsey. UK/USA, 2017. 1h 30m. Starring Joaquin Phoenix, Ekaterina Samsonov, Alessandro Nivola. A tormented enforcer infiltrates the criminal underworld in search of a missing young girl in Lynne Ramsay's (*We Need to Talk About Kevin*) acclaimed subversive revenge thriller. Jonny Greenwood's pulsating electronic soundtrack intensifies the taut drama.



## The Nile Hilton Incident (15)

Dir. Tarik Saleh. Sweden, 2017. 1h 51m. Arabic/French/subs. Starring Fares Fares, Mari Malek, Yasser Ali Maher, Ahmed Selim. In a tense noir-thriller inspired by real events, a police officer investigates the murder of a famous singer in a Cairo hotel room. What initially seems to be a crime of passion turns into something concerning the corrupt political elite of Egypt.

**Shiraz: a Romance of India (U)**  
Dir. Franz Osten. India, 1928. 1h 46m.

Starring Himansu Rai, Charu Roy, Seeta Devi, Enakashi Rama Rao. A silent romantic epic about the romance between 17th-century Mughal ruler Shah Jahan and his queen which led to the creation of one of the world's most iconic structures: the Taj Mahal. This new BFI restoration features a specially commissioned score by Grammy Award-winner Anoushka Shankar.

Dir. Jacques Tati. France, 1967. 2h 4m.

French/subs. Starring Jacques Tati, Barbara Dennek, Rita Maiden, France Rumilly, France Delahalle, Valerie Camille. Clumsy Monsieur Hulot finds himself perplexed by the intimidating complexity of modern Paris. Tati's comedy masterpiece is famed for its enormous set, which he had built specially, as well as his trademark use of subtle, yet elaborate visual gags.
