The Death of Stalin (15)

Dir. Armando Iannucci. UK, 2017. 1h 47m. Starring Jason Isaacs, Steve Buscemi, Andrea Riseborough, Jeffrey Tambor, Paddy Considine, Rupert Friend, Simon Russell Beale. Plotting and paranoia reign at the Kremlin as the Soviet hierarchy jostle for supremacy following the death of their leader. A riotous black-comedy written and directed by Armando Iannucci (*In The Loop*).



I Am Not a Witch (12A)

Dir. Rungano Nyoni. UK/France, 2017. 1h 33m. Starring Gloria Huwiler, Chileshe Kalimamukwento, Travers Merrill. A young Zambian girl is accused of witchcraft and made to choose between living in a travelling witch camp or being transformed into a goat. Rungano Nyoni's bold directorial debut skilfully combines surreal fantasy with deadpan humour in a captivating satire.



Loving Vincent (12A)

Dir. Hugh Welchman, Dorota Kobiela. UK, 2017. 1h 35m. Starring Aidan Turner, Helen McCrory, Jerome Flynn. A visually dazzling animation made up of 65,000 individual oil paintings on canvas painted in Van Gogh's hallucinatory style. The film follows a postman exploring the mystery surrounding Van Gogh's death after being given a letter addressed to the artist.



Remember Baghdad (12A)

Dir. Fiona Murphy. UK, 2017. 1h 10m. Five Jewish families look back on the history of Iraq's once vibrant Jewish community in an illuminating documentary composed of intimate interviews and extensive personal archive film. *The screening will be followed by a Q&A with the film's director, chaired by Sami Cohen, the former Principal of d'Overbroeck's school in Oxford.*

Call Me by Your Name (15)

Dir. Luca Guadagnino. Italy, 2017. 2h 12m. English/Italian/subs. Starring Armie Hammer, Timothée Chalamet, Michael Stuhlbarg, Amira Casar. A sensuous and powerfully affecting portrait of first love by critically-acclaimed director Luca Guadagnino. In Lombardy during the summer of 1983, a 17 year-old Italian boy falls in love with his father's American research intern.



Breathe (12A)

Dir. Andy Serkis. UK, 2017. 1h 57m. Starring Andrew Garfield, Claire Foy, Tom Hollander, Hugh Bonneville, Diana Rigg, Ed Speleers. An elegantly made biopic based on the inspirational lives of pioneering polio survivor Robin Cavendish and his wife Diana. Andrew Garfield and Claire Foy deliver heart-rending central performances in this poignant and romantic historical drama.

Murder on the Orient Express (12A)

Dir. Kenneth Branagh. USA, 2017. 1h 54m. Starring Kenneth Branagh, Penélope Cruz, Willem Dafoe, Judi Dench, Johnny Depp, Josh Gad, Michelle Pfeiffer, Daisy Ridley, Olivia Colman. One dead body, thirteen passengers, and everyone a suspect. Branagh's adaptation of Agatha Christie's classic whodunnit teems with highly entertaining performances from its all-star cast.



The Killing of a Sacred Deer (15)

Dir. Yorgos Lanthimos. UK, 2017. 2h 1m. Starring Colin Farrell, Nicole Kidman, Alicia Silverstone, Barry Keoghan. A characteristically unsettling and engrossing modern Greek tragedy by the director of *The Lobster*. The life of a successful cardiac surgeon is thrown into turmoil after he befriends a fatherless 16 year-old boy whose behaviour becomes increasingly menacing.



Dina (15)

Dir. Dan Sickles, Antonio Santini. USA, 2017. 1h 43m. Starring Dina Buno, Scott Levin. Dina's getting married in a few weeks and there's still so much to do! A delightfully funny and affectionate documentary that follows a couple with autism preparing for their big day. It won the Grand Jury Documentary Prize at this year's Sundance Film Festival.



EOS: David Hockney at the Royal Academy of Arts (U)

Dir. Phil Grabsky. UK, 2017. 1h 20m. Starring David Hockney, Tim Marlow, Martin Gayford, Jonathan Jones, Edith Devaney. A revealing documentary about one of the most popular British artists of the 20th century. The film features intimate and in-depth interviews with Hockney who is now entering his ninth decade and shows no signs of slowing down.
